Twelve paramedic interns completed the 18-month program.



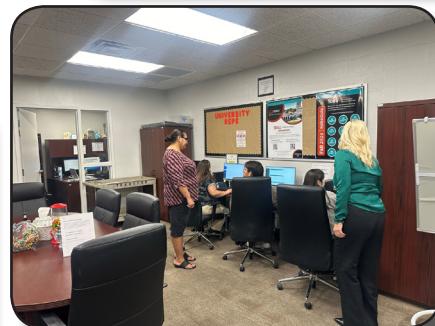
After completing this program, these students will benefit not only themselves and their families but also their departments and, even more so, our community by providing a higher-quality level of pre-hospital medical care.

### The Lotus Living Student Housing Program hosted a Thanksgiving event for student residents, featuring a delicious Thanksgiving-style dinner.

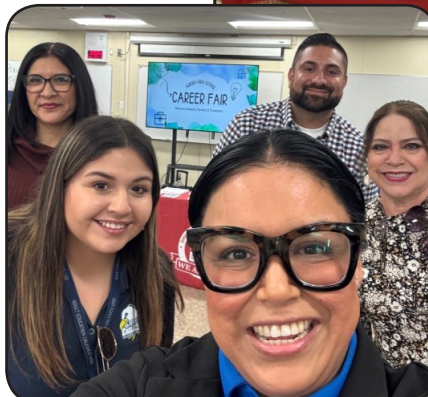
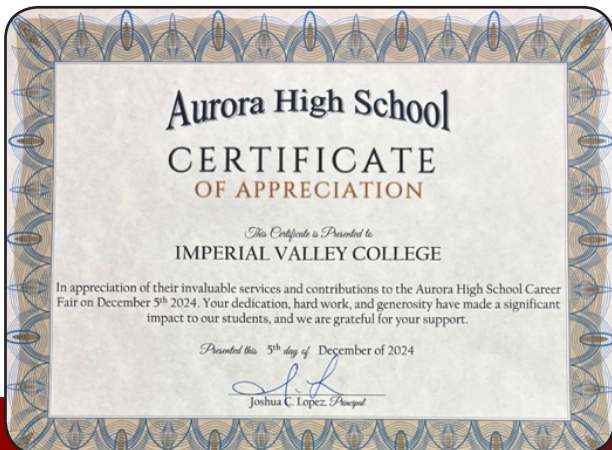

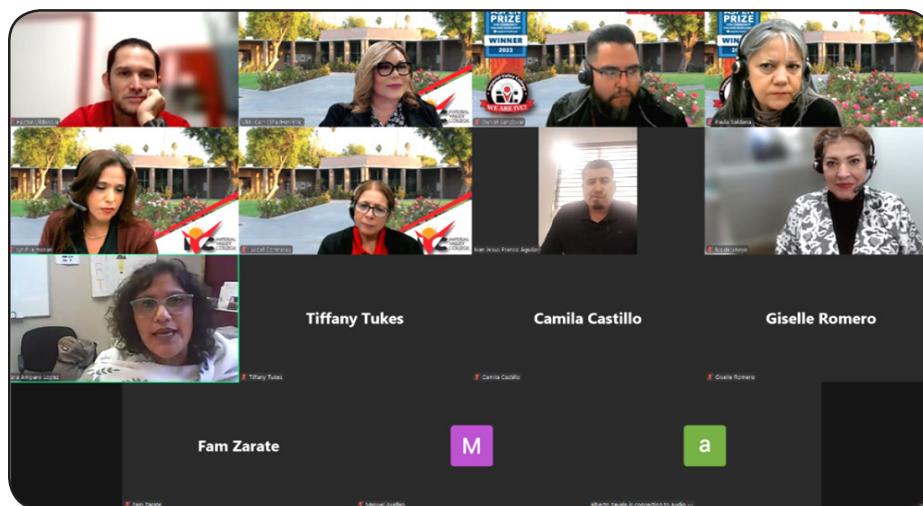

It also provides immediate access to digital versions of their diplomas where they can request duplicate copies online. This one-stop shop allows students to manage both their diplomas and transcripts, anywhere, anytime.

## AB91 PROGRAM Q&A EVENT

On Wednesday, November 20, 2024, Admissions & Records held a Q&A Event on Zoom for prospective students interested in applying for the AB91 Program.



The AB-91 Program establishes a 4-year pilot program to allow low-income students who have residence within 45 miles of the California-Mexico border, for at least one year immediately before enrolling, to be eligible for in-state tuition rates at Imperial Valley College or another San Diego and Imperial Counties Community College Association (SDICCCA) member college, located in California.

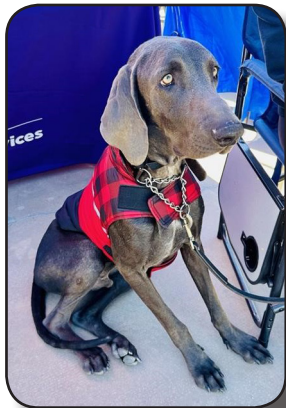
