LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Policy Committees will begin meeting to hear bills from March – May. This year, legislators are limited to 35 bills for a 2-year session. Total of 4,200 bills for 2 years.



LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Introduced Bills

AB 1462 (Hart): Baccalaureate degree program: Allan Hancock College

Authorizes the Board of Governors to approve a baccalaureate degree program at Allan Hancock College without a written agreement established between an objecting higher education segment and the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges.

AB 731 (Fong): College and Career Access Pathways partnerships

Requires CCAP partnership agreements to allow students to complete a single application for dual enrollment throughout their time as special part-time students at a community college. It specifies that courses may be offered both asynchronously and synchronously but prioritizes in-person instruction, with online formats permitted only when an in-person course is unavailable.

AB 988 (Fong): College and Career Access Pathways partnerships: task force

Establishes the Dual Enrollment Framework Task Force under the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the Chancellor of California Community Colleges to develop recommendations for a statewide dual enrollment framework.

AB 1122 (Bryan): Dual enrollment

Requires, starting in the 2029–30 academic year, local educational agencies without a dual enrollment program to establish one with a community college district. It encourages partnerships with existing programs like College and Career Access Pathways or early/middle college high schools.

Priority Legislation: Financial Aid and Fees

ACR 40 (Fong): Student financial aid: FAFSA data

Would state the Legislature and the State of California's commitment to protecting, to the fullest extent of the law, all the FAFSA data provided by students and their families.

AB 850 (Pacheco): Institutional Debt Transparency Act

Limits all post-secondary institutions from placing an enrollment or registration hold on students who owe institutional debt unless all the following are done:

The institution grants a one-time exemption from an enrollment/registration hold to a student. The institution notifies the student of the one-time exemption in writing and that the accumulation of additional debt or failure to pay or enter into a payment plan by the end of the academic term may result in an enrollment or registration hold.

The enrollment/registration hold is not placed on students within good standing on a payment plan.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Priority Legislation: Housing and Facilities

AB 90 (Jackson): Overnight student parking

Requires the governing board of each community college district to adopt a plan to offer an overnight parking program to students at each college within the district.

- Colleges must designate at least one parking lot per campus with 50 spots.
- The Governing Board must vote on the plan annually until approved.
- Parking permit length is a minimum of 4-weeks, up to one semester.
- Students may park in the lot until a "suitable alternative" is provided, defined as stable housing for more than 3 weeks.
- After establishing a program, the Basic Needs Coordinator must oversee the program by developing a document with the rules and procedures and begin accepting applications within one month of the board's approval.
- Costs are estimated to be \$600,000 per college or \$70 million statewide.

Concerns:

- Many colleges already offer temporary housing solutions, including hotel or Airbnb vouchers, direct aid via emergency housing grants, rapid rehousing, rental subsidies, partnerships with local non-profit organizations, and referrals to transitional housing.
- Resources would be better utilized towards expanding current offerings or establishing long-term solutions such as financial support and permanent housing.
